
THE SOCIAL, HUMANITARIAN AND CULTURAL COMMITTEE

Social, Humanitarian and Cultural Committee (SOCHUM) is one of the six main committees at the General Assembly. It promotes and enforces basic freedoms and ideals meant to be enjoyed by the entire international community and deals with humanitarian affairs and social matters related to refugees, women, children, indigenous populations, crime prevention and criminal justice, and the international drug trade.

Belarusian President, Alexander Lukashenko, issued a concerning threat to the European Union, stating that he would flood Europe with drugs and migrants if sanctions were imposed on his country due to the forced landing of a Ryanair plane. As promised, Lukashenko initiated what is now known as the migrant crisis. Thousands of illegal immigrants started arriving in Poland, Lithuania, and Latvia via Belarus' borders. The situation has become increasingly volatile, with the involvement of Russian military forces adding to the complexity of the crisis.

Given the urgency and gravity of the matter, SOCHUM must reach a consensus on how to respond to this act of hybrid warfare. Providing effective resolutions to the General Assembly to address humanitarian concerns is paramount to upholding the committee's mandate and safeguarding the rights and well-being of the affected migrants.



UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) has consistently maintained an active and unwavering commitment to addressing concerns that pertain to international law and peacekeeping since its inception in 1945. The council consistently demonstrates that it has the willingness to take on novel challenges and resolve crucial matters of immense significance.

The Hutus in Rwanda started to desire political control in the late 1950s. Despite Hutus being the dominant ethnic group, the Tutsis had historically held the majority of the positions of authority. This unrest resulted in a significant upsurge of the Hutu movement, which led to a bloody revolution. Tragically, hundreds of Tutsis were forced to abandon the country under extremely upsetting conditions as a result of this.

RPF led by the Tutsi exiles entered Rwanda from Uganda in a significant invasion in 1990. Numerous people had to be relocated as a result of the RPF attacks. International institutions attempted to defuse the situation by sending peacekeepers to Rwanda, but they lacked the funding and authority to put an end to the atrocities.

In conference, delegates will be expected to take swift actions in order to ensure international security and successfully carry out the conference's general mandate.

JOINT CRISIS COMMITTEE

Emerging on the heels of the Cold War, the Vietnam War is a global conflict amidst the dense and unforgiving jungles of Southeast Asia between the communist led North Vietnam aided by China and the USSR, and the USA backed South Vietnam. Over the tension between these groups looms the larger ideological power tussle between the two major superpowers in the world.

This conflict will play out in the form of a Joint Crisis Committee with a South Vietnamese and North Vietnamese cabinet. Each cabinet is faced with the daunting task of making the best possible decisions to achieve their objective of creating a new postcolonial order in Vietnam. Following the Gulf of Tonkin incident, the US has increased its direct involvement in the war, and the situation has escalated. The delegates have to cope with the fast pace of the committee and think on their feet to deal with the crises given by their opposing cabinet and external problems, keeping in mind the final aim of their respective cabinets.



THE INTERNATIONAL PRESS JOURNALISM

Journalists are inarguably one of the most important parts of the committee in an MUN as ensuring that the gap between the world's leaders and the world's citizens is bridged. Journalists are the beacon that shed light upon the uncertainties of this day and age, bringing plausible and trustworthy news to our doorsteps so that we are empowered by our awareness and can take action towards the betterment of our world.

The public is made aware of the decisions being taken by the delegates of their committees, analysing the events and noticing the minor details. Descriptive articles concerning the current affairs, the topic of discussion and the opinions of the delegates are reported by journalists, keeping the people informed by recounting the complexities of the committee, and taking apart the nuances of diplomacy and bias to provide the people with the full and accurate picture.

Journalists chronicle the proceedings of the conference, portraying the events that unfold in their own unique and creative ways whilst striving to uphold the ideals of democracy. Journalists must fulfil their role in maintaining transparency from the committees to the people, and must hold the delegates responsible for their words and actions with sharp words.



THE INTERNATIONAL PRESS CARICATURE

A caricature in a Model United nation refers to a simplified or exaggerated representation of a particular country, leader, or situation in international diplomacy. Caricatures can be represented in various forms ranging from cartoons, drawings to verbal descriptions that emphasize certain characteristics or behaviors to either critique or make a point. Caricatures are generally to highlight or mock the actions, policies, or positions of an UN member state or it's representative instead of serving as official documents.

The caricaturists committee of MISMUN consists of participants who take on the role of reporting proceedings through detailed artworks and imagery. Their primary task is to create satirical and exaggerated pieces or form descriptions of key figures or issues. Caricaturists tend to use their skills to depict the personalities and actions of delegates in a playful manner so as to appeal to the humour of citizens while simultaneously informing them about events taking place in the conference.

They form the more creative and lighthearted aspect of an MUN, individuals are offered a chance to explore the more artistic side of their personality in a typically formal environment of an MUN. It provides an opportunity for participants to showcase and develop more of their daring visions while being engaged in a tumultuous political environment.



THE INTERNATIONAL PRESS PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography is a powerful medium that captures moments in time, preserving them as visual memories. It allows individuals to express creativity while documenting the world around them. Photographers convey emotions, tell stories, and evoke reactions. The Photography division of the International press provides a way for photographers to engage in MUN through the way of the camera. Photographers at the conferences are typically responsible for capturing moments, delegates in action, and the overall atmosphere of the event. They play a crucial role in documenting and preserving memories.
